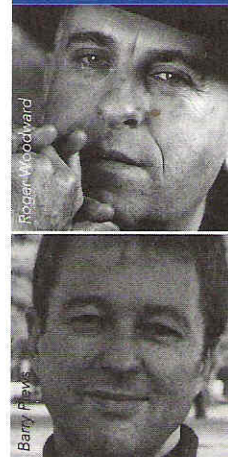
International Festival of New Music

It is with great pleasure that we celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Sydney Spring with you. This year's festival, featuring 18 performances, 47 composers and more than 160 artists, will present compositions from eastern and western Europe, North America, Asia and Australia. The program includes the world premiere performances of four new works from four outstanding Australian composers — works for solo harp by Matthew Hindson, Paul Stanhope and Brendan Colbert and a work scored for flutes, piano and percussion by Rosalind Page — all of whom, we are proud to say, were commissioned by the artists performing their music: Marshall McGuire and Kathleen Gallagher. A new initiative, the Young Composers' Salon, showcases the emerging talents of some of Sydney's younger composers and musicians in a series of engaging, short (and free!) performances. We also welcome the return of the Reykjavik Wind Quintet. They should not be missed.

Whether you are a passionate 'fellow traveller' or merely curious about new music, whether you are drawn to Skryabin and Prokofiev or the barely dried ink of the most recent Australian work, we trust that you will discover enough 'new' music at the 10th Sydney Spring to inspire you and excite your imagination.
